¹³ The Passover of the Jews was near,
and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. ¹⁴In the
temple he found people selling cattle,
sheep, and doves, and the money-
changers seated at their tables. ¹⁵Making a
whip of cords, he drove all of them out of
the temple, both the sheep and the cattle.
He also poured out the coins of the
money-changers and overturned their
tables. ¹⁶He told those who were selling
the doves, 'Take these things out of here!
Stop making my Father's house a market-
place!' ¹⁷His disciples remembered that it
was written, 'Zeal for your house will
consume me.' ¹⁸The Jews then said to him,

'What sign can you show us for doing
this?' ¹⁹Jesus answered them, 'Destroy this
temple, and in three days I will raise it up.'

²⁰The Jews then said, 'This temple has
been under construction for forty-six years,
and will you raise it up in three days?' ²¹But
he was speaking of the temple of his body.

²²After he was raised from the dead, his
disciples remembered that he had said
this; and they believed the scripture and
the word that Jesus had spoken.

²³ When he was in Jerusalem during the
Passover festival, many believed in his
name because they saw the signs that he
was doing. ²⁴But Jesus on his part would
not entrust himself to them, because he
knew all people ²⁵and needed no one to
testify about anyone; for he himself knew
what was in everyone.
