



Thoughts on TRANSITION from Pastor Sara

Transition. It's complicated! It is a call for con versation, detail work, and prayer!

It's true... congregational pastors are like other employees in many ways, like responsibility and accountability to the organization, just doing the job, but in many ways, the pastor's full role is different, more complicated, and the *search* for a new pastor is complicated, too. Let's consider three tasks in the search.

First, conversation. We talk and listen. Because a congregation is a long-term, relational community, the fit for a next pastor needs multiple inputs of information. The insights of the most involved to the most recent newcomer carry weight, as do the current worship, programmatic, and governance needs. All this information takes time to collect, analyze, and put into writing.

In addition, because a congregation is situated in a specific location, a unique community or setting, and its members and mission are connected to that location, the descriptions of the town (region), business culture, educational systems, and medical community warrant a fresh articulation in each call process. This takes time. This takes **detail work.** The MSP Team leads the way, inviting others to contribute.

Then, more detail work. With the help of elected leaders, the MSP Team considers what gifts and skills are important to have in a new top leader. The team looks at the key tasks of the upcoming years and what experience may be needed. Giftedness and training, life experiences and personality will all be considered as the team describes this congregation's needs in a next pastor.

Finally, prayer. There's no question that conversation and detail work go into the writing and assembling of the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) document. Most of this work is coordinated by the MSP Team, but the final transition task to mention in this article is **prayer** and can be done by all who love this church. So, let us pray. For God the Holy Spirit does the most foundational work of all, connecting pastors and congregations through the decades, for who else sees and knows the movement of people from place to place over time? Who else knows what God is doing here in this place?

First Lutheran Church, let's remember that God knows the needs of this congregation and God knows the gifting and readiness of the person now being called to serve here. Who may God be sending this way? Someone that God knows and is preparing as I write and as you read.




3 For Heaven's Sake Class will meet <u>Sunday, February 18th</u> from 10:15-11:00a.m. We will now be meeting in the nursery!


